- Parents and guardians are important partners & digital role models

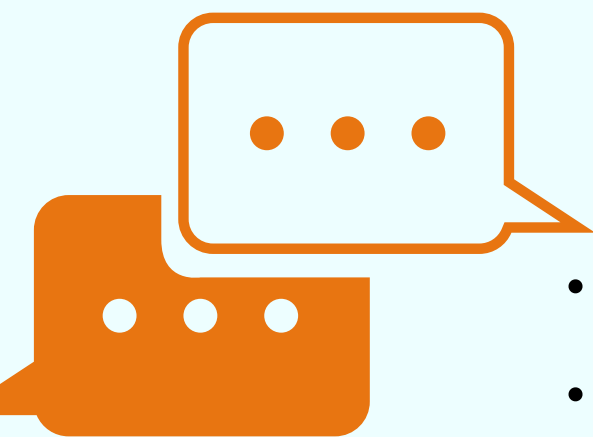


FLEXIBLE SCHEDULE

A daily condensed schedule will provide structure and routine for students and parents. Students will have flexibility to work outside of the scheduled times. **The schedule for students in grades K-2 will include a morning meeting/message, approximately 1 to 1-1/2 hours of work on foundational skills in addition to online activities in science, social studies, physical education and a focus on one of the special areas of art, library and music every day.**

COMMUNICATION

- Outreach to families whose students are not participating regularly to see if they need assistance

NO FORMAL GRADES

- **C - Complete (Evidence of Learning):** A student has demonstrated learning of curriculum based on what was taught or assigned.
- **I - Incomplete (Not Yet Learning):** Student has not completed assignment or work completed does not yet demonstrate learning of the curriculum. Students will have the opportunity to resubmit work.
